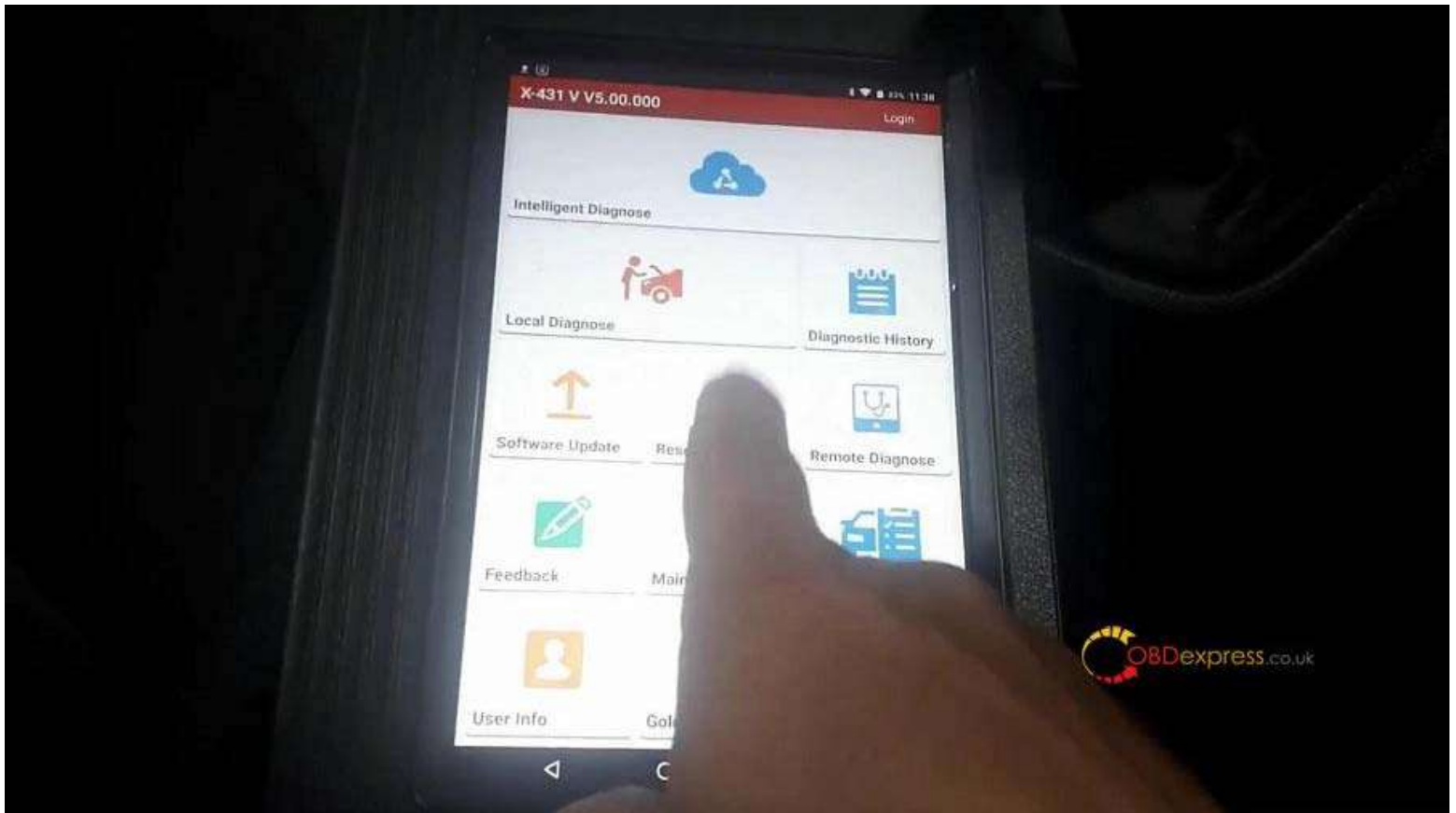


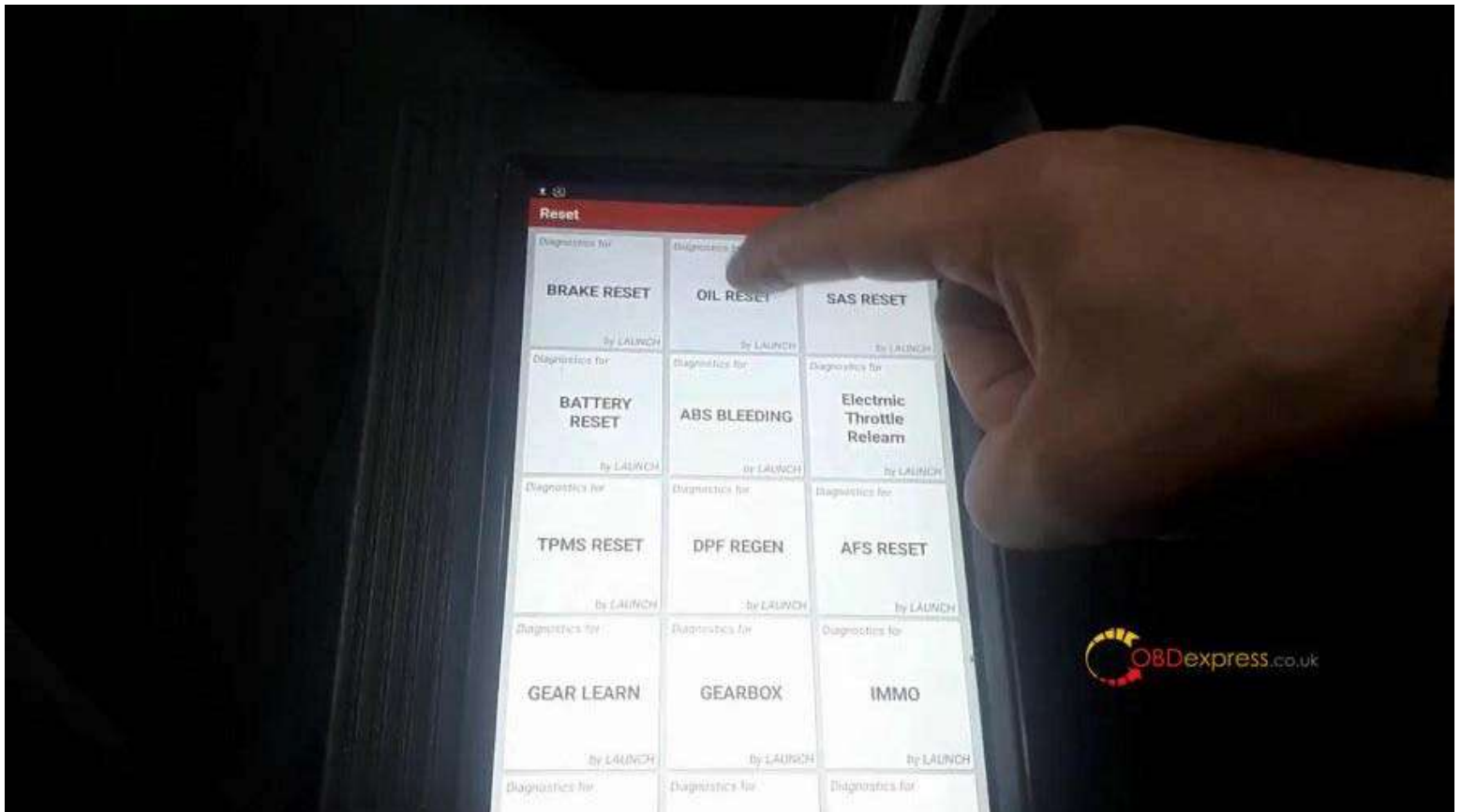
This article will show how to use [Launch x431 V](#) enable Service Interval on Hyundai I10 I20.



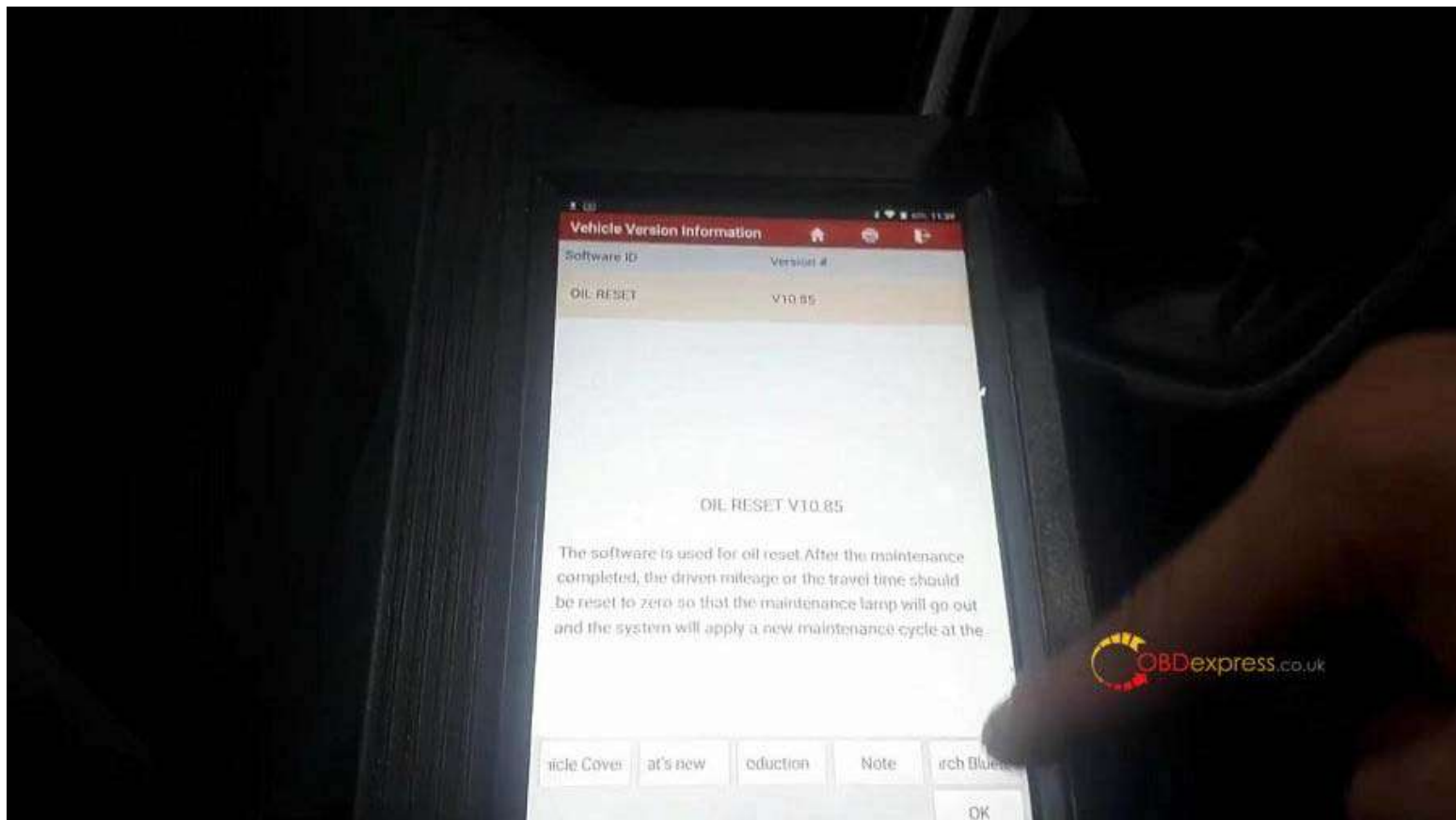
Go to "Reset".



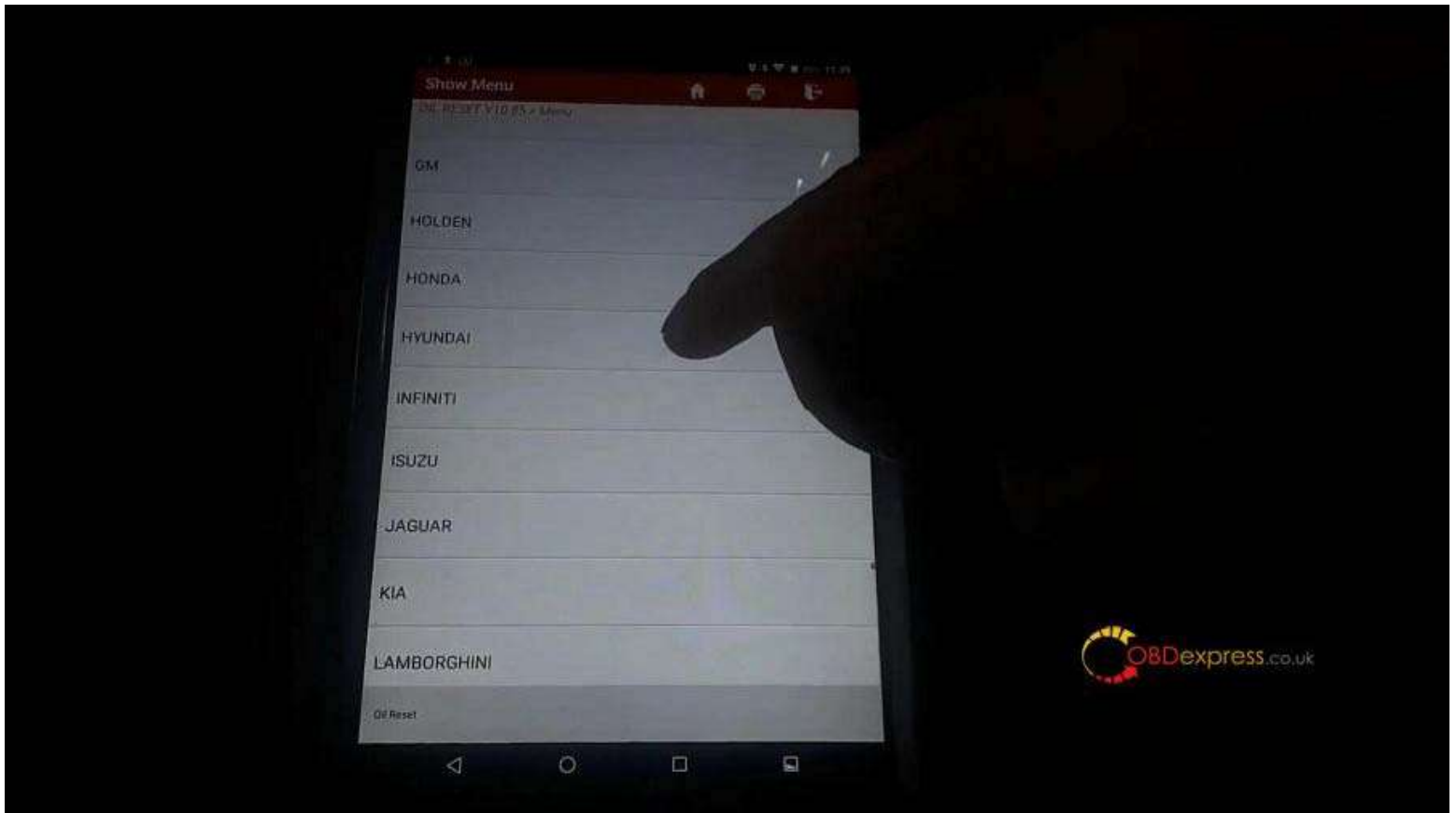
Oil reset.



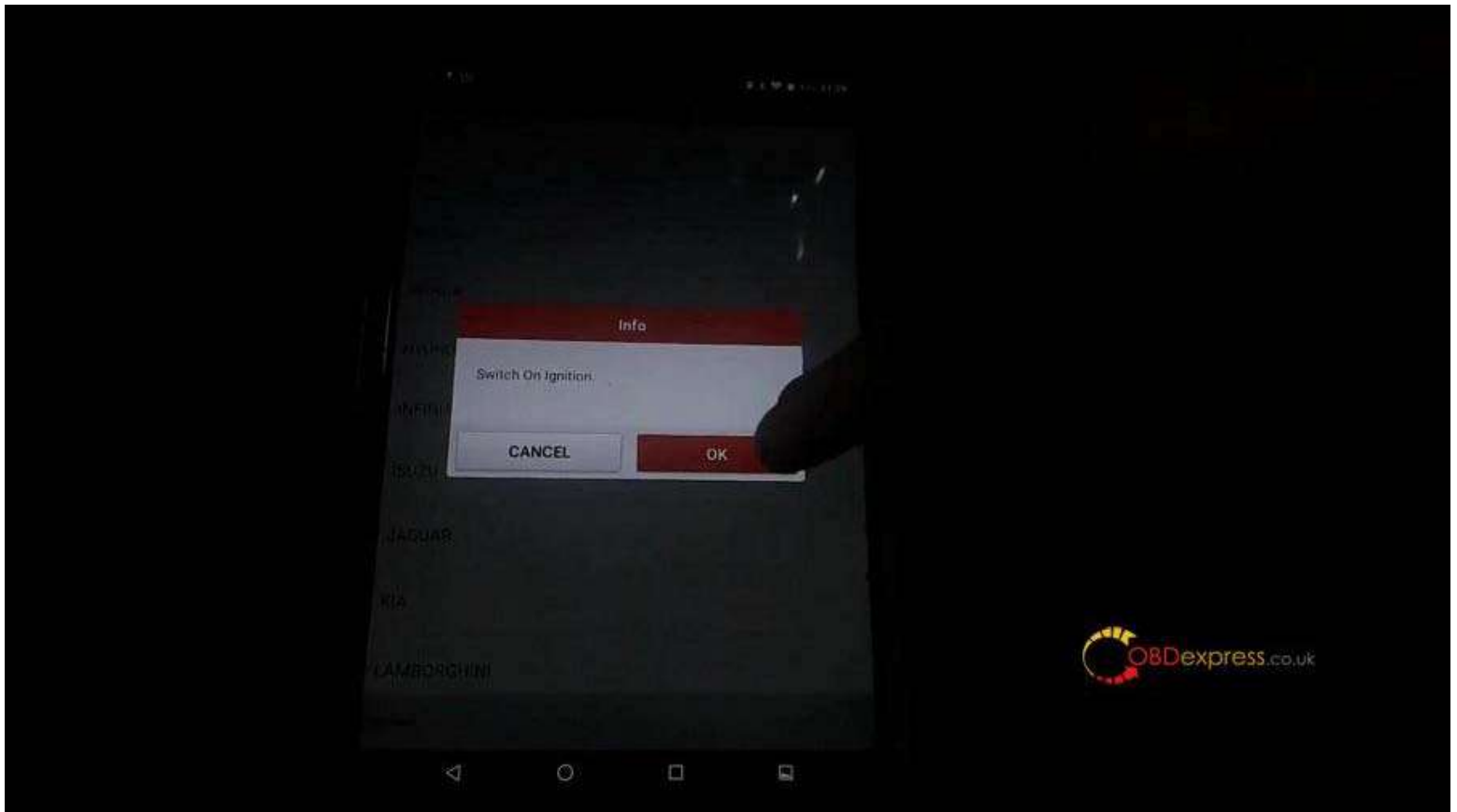
Tap "OK".



Go to "Hyundai".

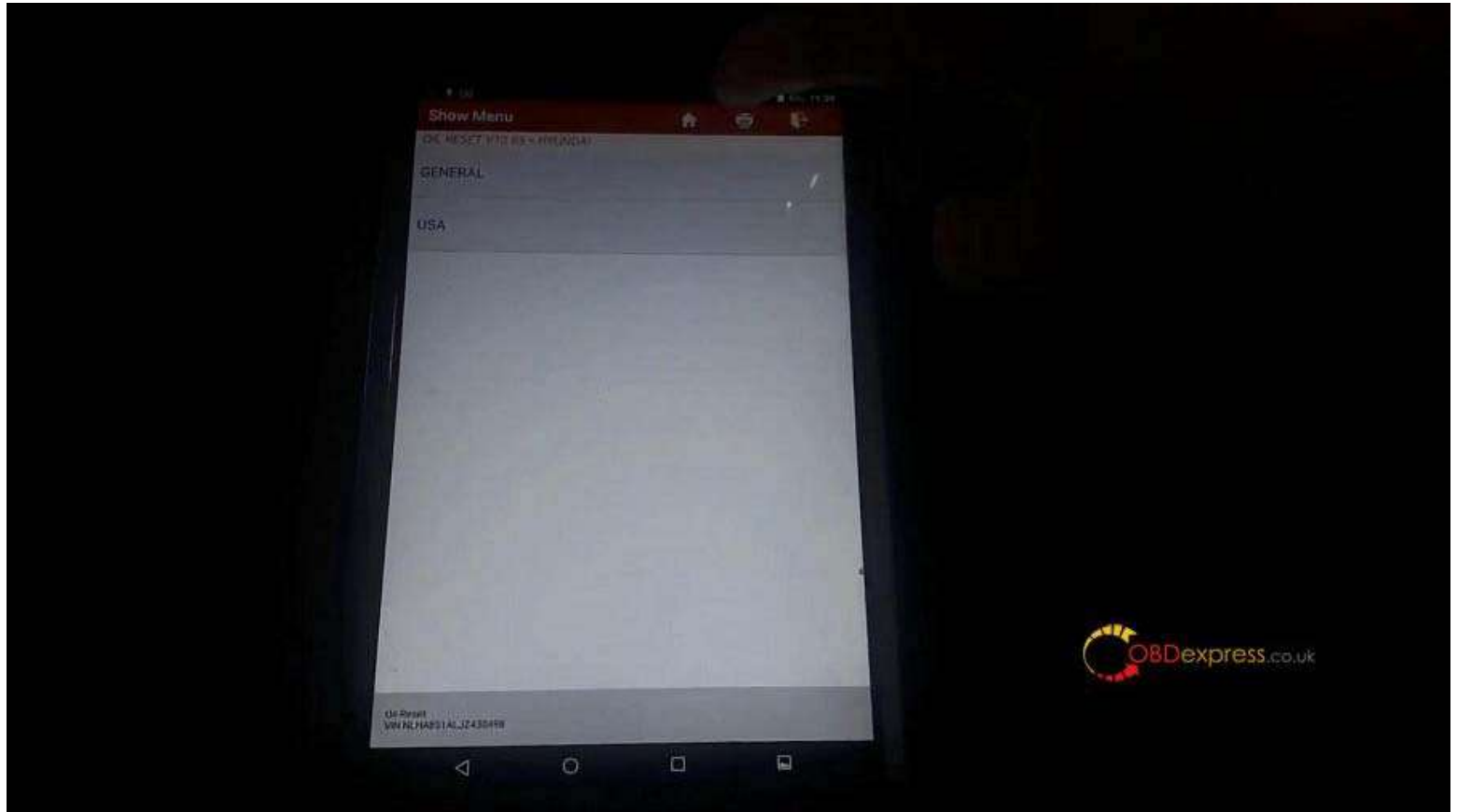


Switch on ignition as the screen pops up.

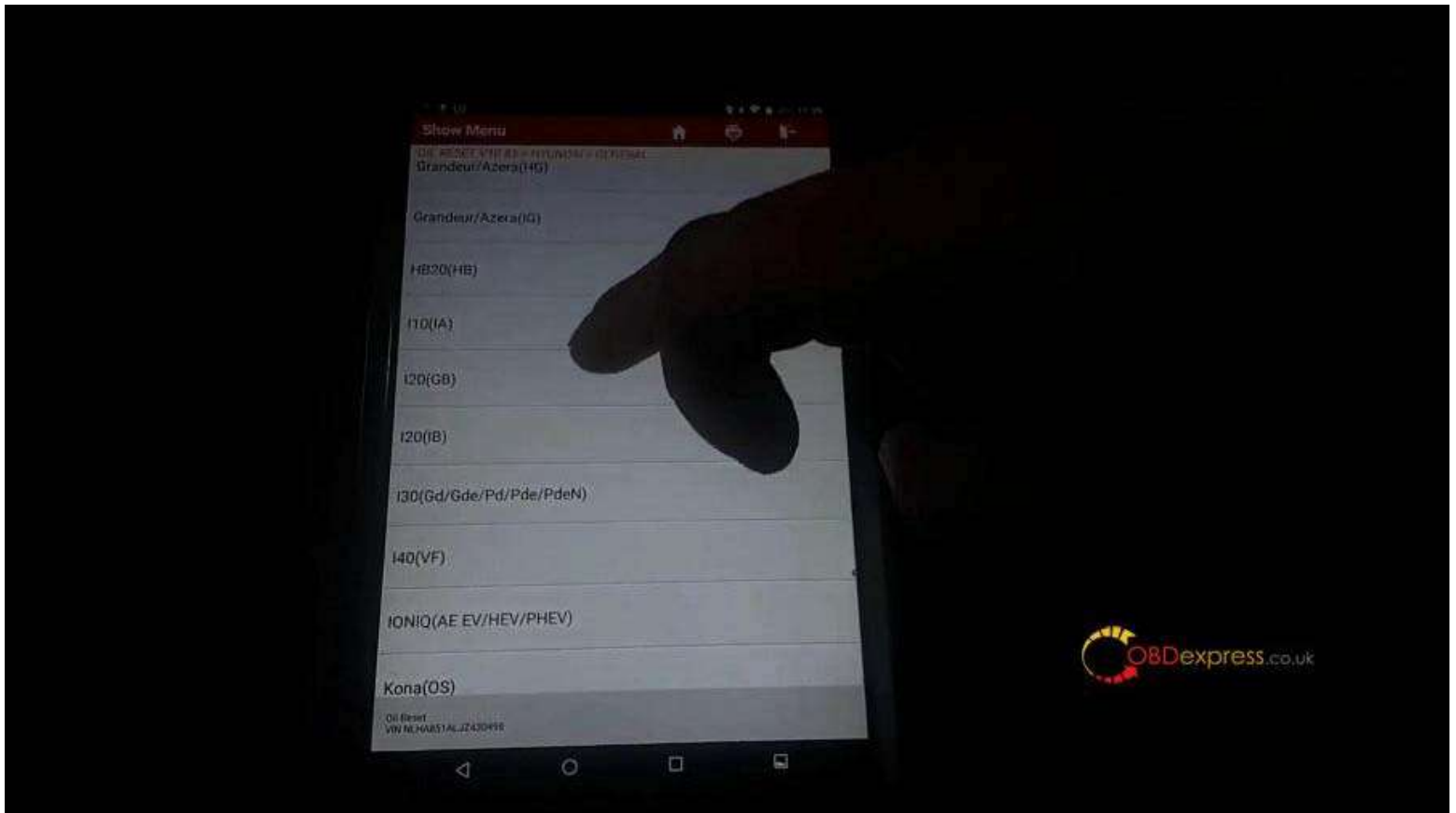


It will automatically read out the Vin number.

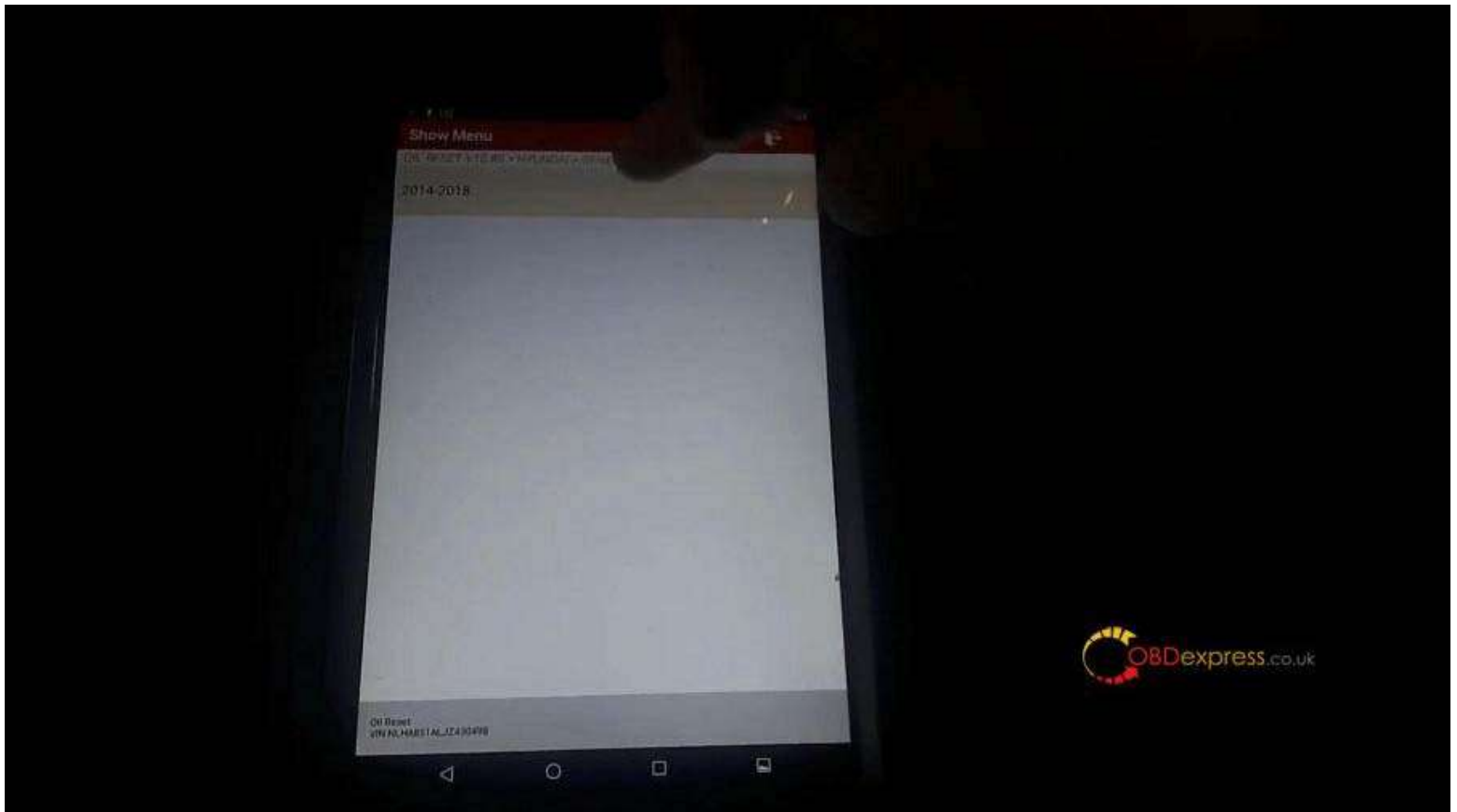
Tap "General".



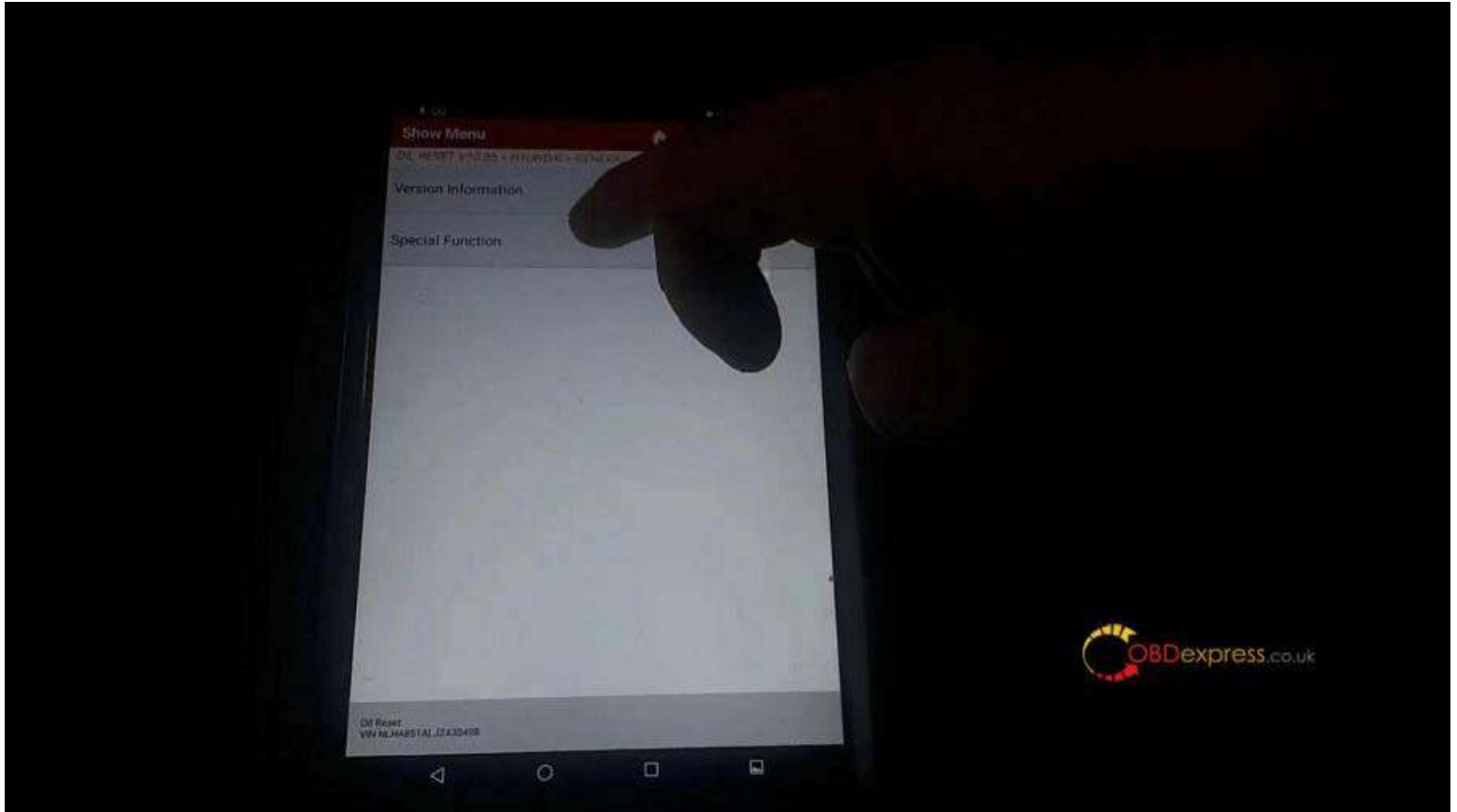
Tap "110 (IA)".



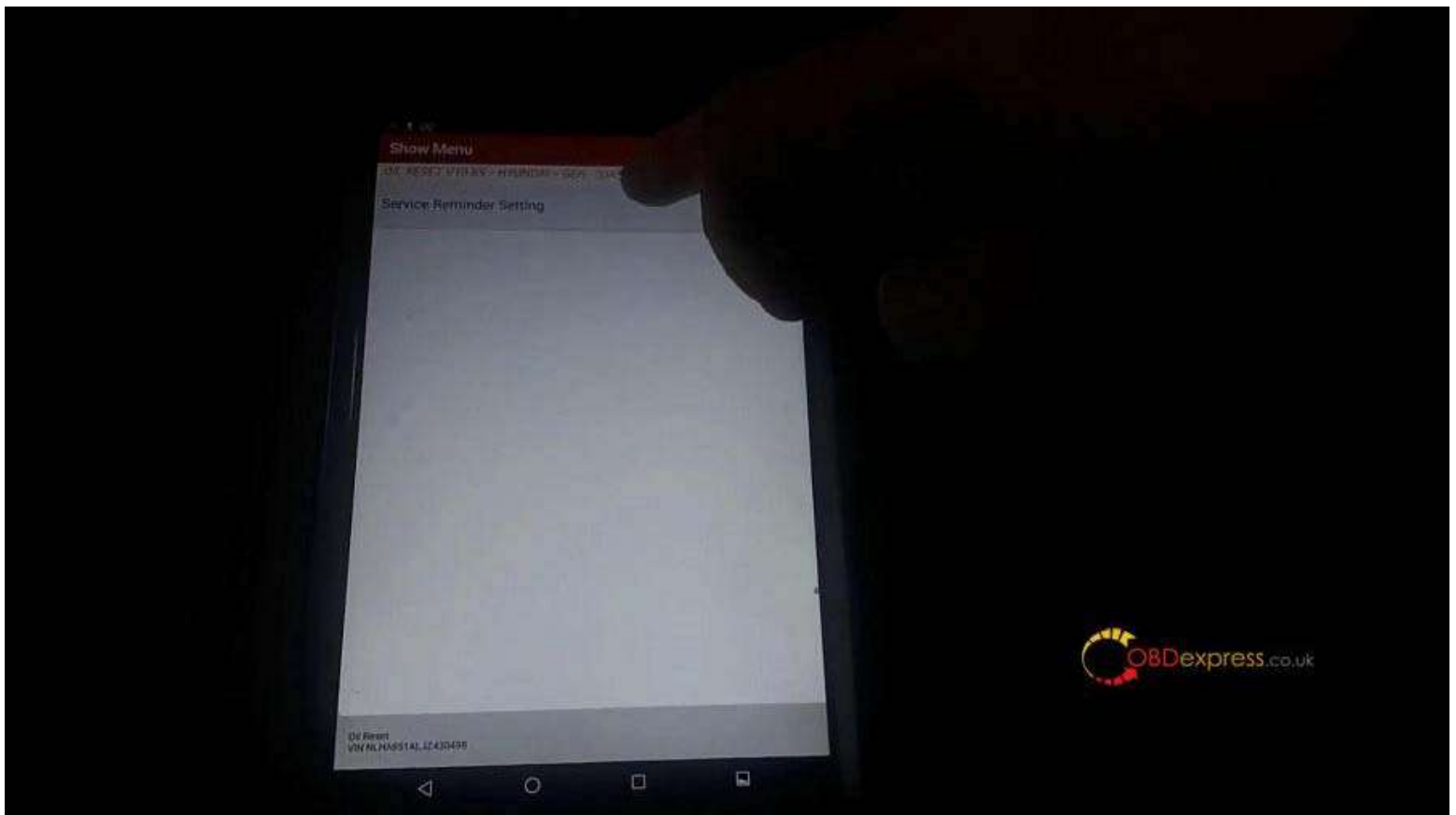
